

FEAR - PART 2

Fear

Horses are Flight Animals - if the Rider has not established a Confident Commanding Presence and a leadership Role - Then you have become simply a passenger and you are essentially "Fired" - the horse resorts to his instincts which is flight, herd bound, and reactive to outside stimuli. The Rider is essentially at the mercy of the horse's emotional state

If you have established a Confident Commanding Presence then you have become a leader with which your horse places his trust and attention in your care. His attention is on your commands rather than the horses in the group, he looks to you for guidance if he becomes fearful rather than spooking and bolting and he becomes responsive to your cues rather than reactive.

So how do you replace fear and acquire this Confident Commanding Presence?

It starts on the ground. Remember - The horse you lead is the horse you ride.

it is NOT about what your horse is spooking at whether it is a tarp or plastic bag,

it is *NOT* about your horse refusing to do what is asked of him whether its an obstacle or loading in the trailer,

it is NOT about your horse bolting,

it is *NOT* about your horse kicking, biting, striking or bucking or rearing. These are all symptoms that are caused by either a Lack of Respect, Fear, Aggression or a little of each. Correct the cause by going to the ground and do some training.

There isn't anything that we do on the ground that we don't think about transferring to the saddle - we work on speed control (rate)- and that includes putting the go and yes Ma'am attitude in a disrespectful no-go horse- as well as teaching the runaway the value in standing still and stopping on a light request, softness in all the 5 body parts- the head, neck, shoulders, rib cage and hips, sacking out, responsive and light back ups, dragging ropes, and jumping.

All this can be accomplished from the ground - this is the building of a strong foundation.

We get a lot of "Problem Horses" to train - First thing First - we take our training to the ground. Then when we have accomplished all of the above - we never have to deal with the problem.

Below Im going through the ground training on Drifter. When the owner would try and ride him out on trail by himself or even try to lead him away from her ranch alone- as little as 300 yards away he would begin to buck and spin. So we went to the ground - inside and outside turns, dragging ropes and tarps, etc. Then we began our solo trail rides - our first one was about 10 minutes out, then back - everyday we increased the time and distance - he never bucked or spun or misbehaved.
